



Tour 1: The Foothills

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
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Preparing for your trip

The stops on Tour 1 cover a lot of ground, from Red Mountain Open Space in the north to Devil's Backbone Open space to the south. Regardless of the time of year, weather can change quickly, so be prepared.

If you plan on exploring the hiking, biking, or horseback riding trails at any of these locations, be sure to bring adequate clothing, plenty of water, and trail maps. Bring your cameras, guide books, and binoculars for wildlife viewing.

You'll find directions for each stop on the tour, along with an activities page, in the rest of this guide. Print it and bring it along on your journey.




Trails of Northern Colorado exploring cultural and natural heritage



Red Mountain Open Space

31.1 mi - starting at College Ave and Mulberry in Fort Collins




Head north on College Ave/US 287	2.4 mi
Turn right at CO 1 N/Terry Lake Rd	3.8 mi
Turn left at N County Rd 15 Continue to follow N County Rd 15	13.3 mi
Continue onto W County Rd 84	2.0 mi
W County Rd 84 turns slightly left and becomes N County Rd 19	0.6 mi
Turn right at County Rd 21	8.9 mi
Slight right Destination will be on the left	0.1 mi





Gateway Natural Area

 $16.0\ mi$ – starting at College Ave and Mulberry in Fort Collins




Head north on College Ave/US 287 N Continue to follow US 287 N	4.2 mi
Turn right at CO 14 W/US 287 N	6.1 mi
Turn left at CO 14 W/Poudre Canyon Hwy	5.2 mi
Slight right at Poudre Canyon Hwy/State Hwy 14	0.4 mi





Reservoir Ridge Natural Area 6.8 mi – starting at College Ave and Mulberry in Fort Collins




Head west on Mulberry St Continue to follow US 287 N	3.0 mi
Turn right at Overland Trail/County Rd 21	2.3 mi
Turn left at W Co Rd 50/Michaud Ln	0.7 mi
Slight left to stay on W Co Rd 50/Michaud Ln Destination will be on the right	0.7 mi





Horsetooth Mountain Open Space

12.0 mi – starting at College Ave and Mulberry in Fort Collins




Head south on College Ave	3.0 mi
Turn right at W Horsetooth Rd	2.0 mi
Turn left at Co Rd 19/S Taft Hill Rd	0.5 mi
Turn right at W Co Rd 38E	6.5 mi
Turn right at Red Cliff Rd	46 ft





Bobcat Ridge Natural Area

16.4 mi – starting at College Ave and Mulberry in Fort Collins




Head south on College Ave	3.0 mi
Turn right at W Horsetooth Rd	2.0 mi
Turn left at Co Rd 19/S Taft Hill Rd	0.5 mi
Turn right at W Co Rd 38E	9.8 mi
Turn left at Buckhorn Rd/N Co Rd 27	0.6 mi
Take the 1st right onto Co Rd 32C	0.5 mi
Slight left Destination will be on the right	151 ft





Devil's Backbone Open Space

16.8 mi – starting at College Ave and Mulberry in Fort Collins




Drive south on College Ave/US 287 S	11.3 mi
Continue straight onto N Lincoln Ave	0.6 mi
Continue onto Cleveland Ave	0.3 mi
Turn right at E Eisenhower Blvd/US 34 W	4.2 mi
Slight right at Plaster Mill Rd	0.2 mi
Take the 1st left onto W County Rd 22B/Wild Lane	141 ft
Take the 1st right onto Peep O Day	0.1 mi
Turn right	0.1 mi
