I am going to have fun at Little STEAMers!



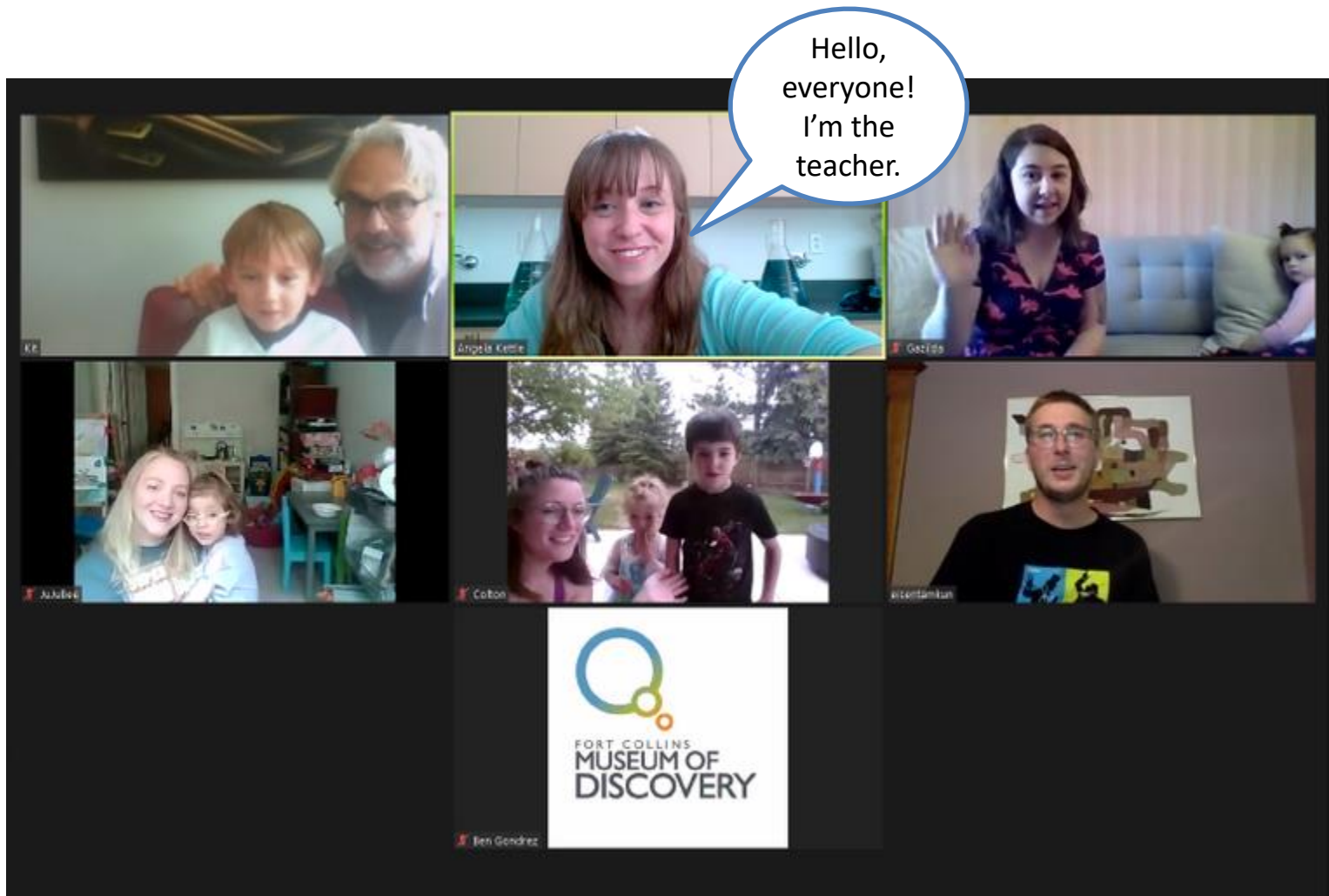
Normally, I would go to the museum for Little STEAMers. But since the museum building is closed, I will take part from my home with my grown-up!



First, my grown-up will help me get on a device, like a laptop, tablet, or phone. I will be able to see other children with their grown-ups on the screen. They will be able to see me, too!



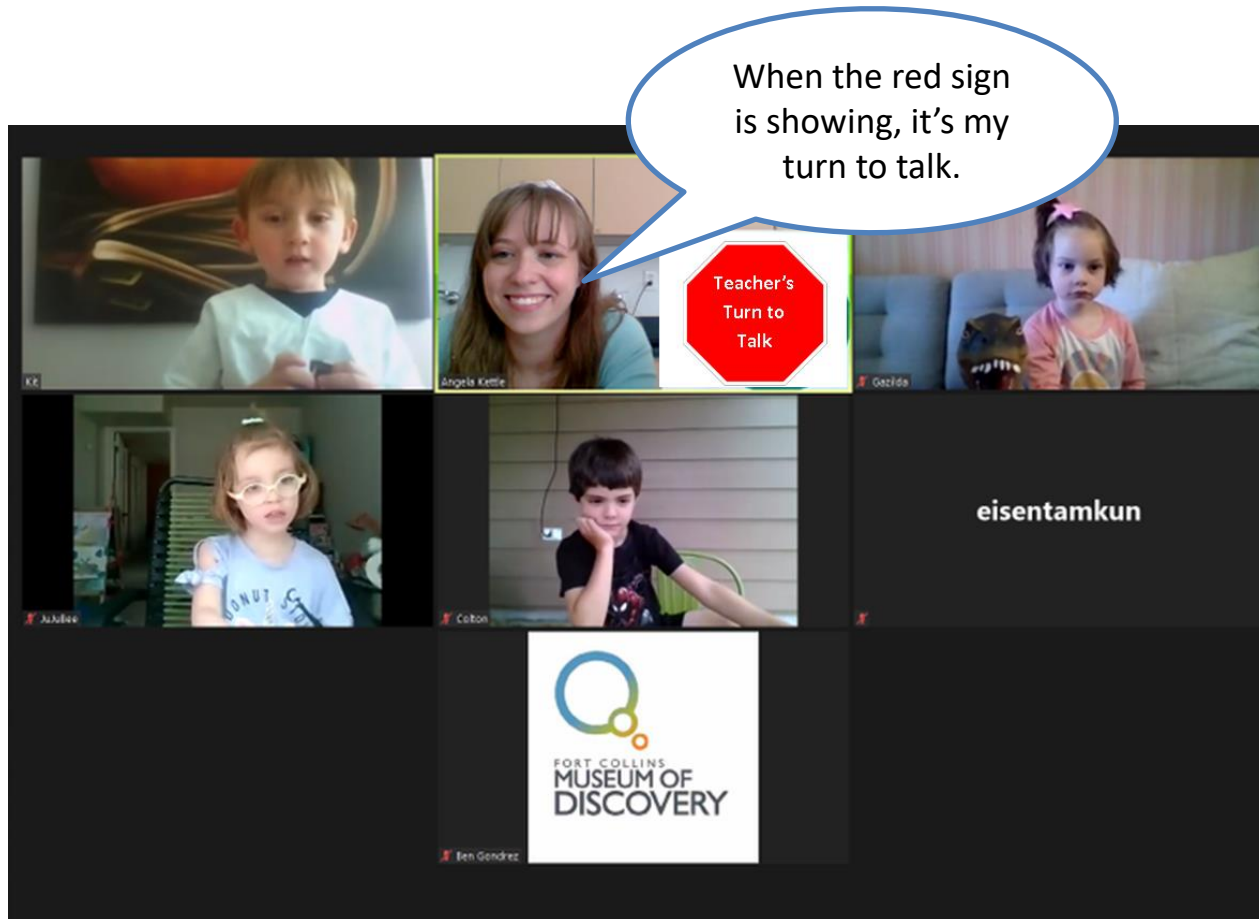
Pretty soon, the teacher will start talking. The teacher works for the museum. The teacher is there to help me and my classmates.



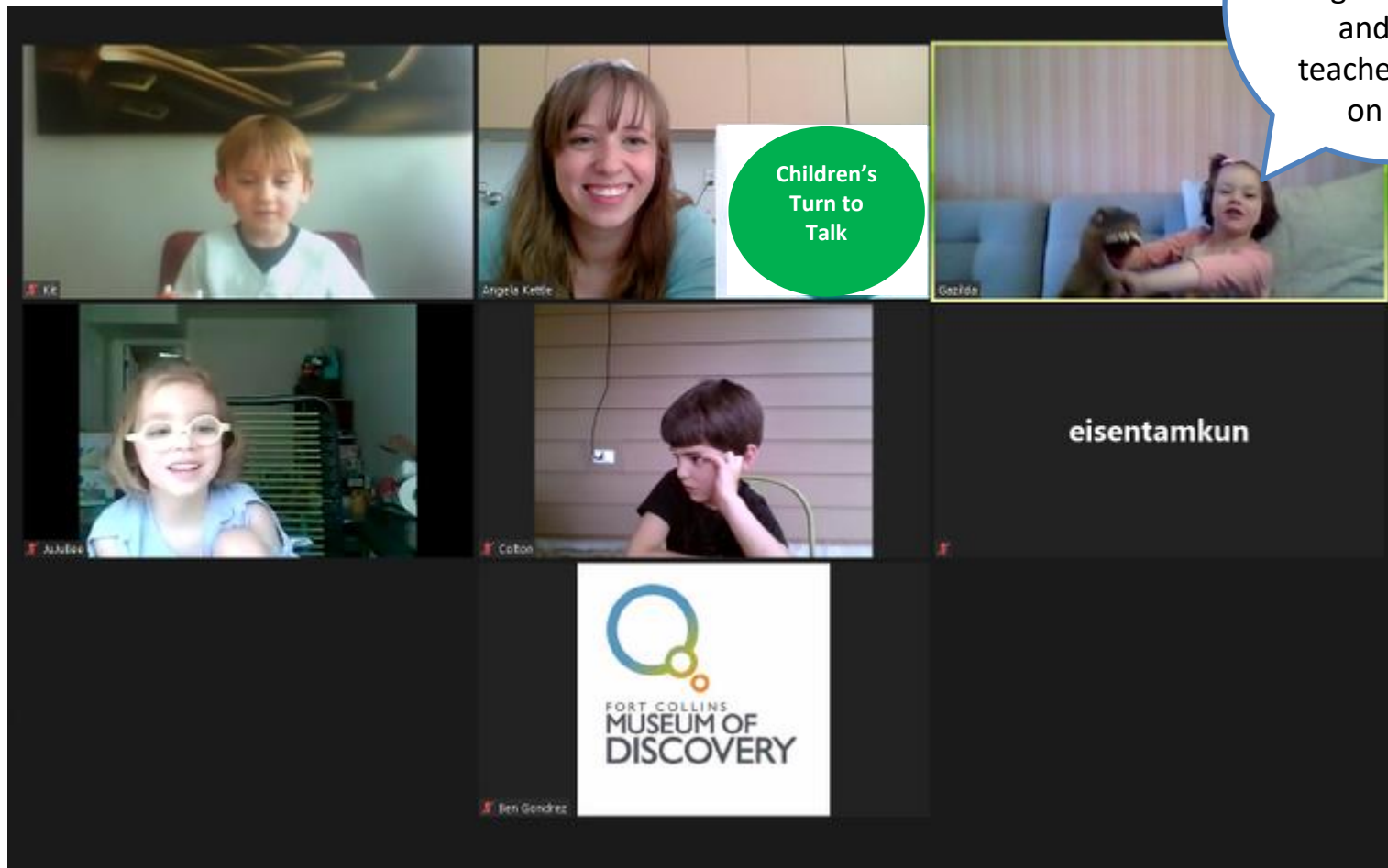


First, the teacher will go over some rules for the class, to help everyone be polite and respectful.

**Red Stop Sign Rule:** When the teacher has a red stop sign in their screen, it means that it's the teacher's turn to talk, and it is the children's turn to listen. When the red stop sign is showing, my device is muted. This means that no one on the computer screen can hear me, even if I am talking very loud. My grown-up will still be able to hear me, though.

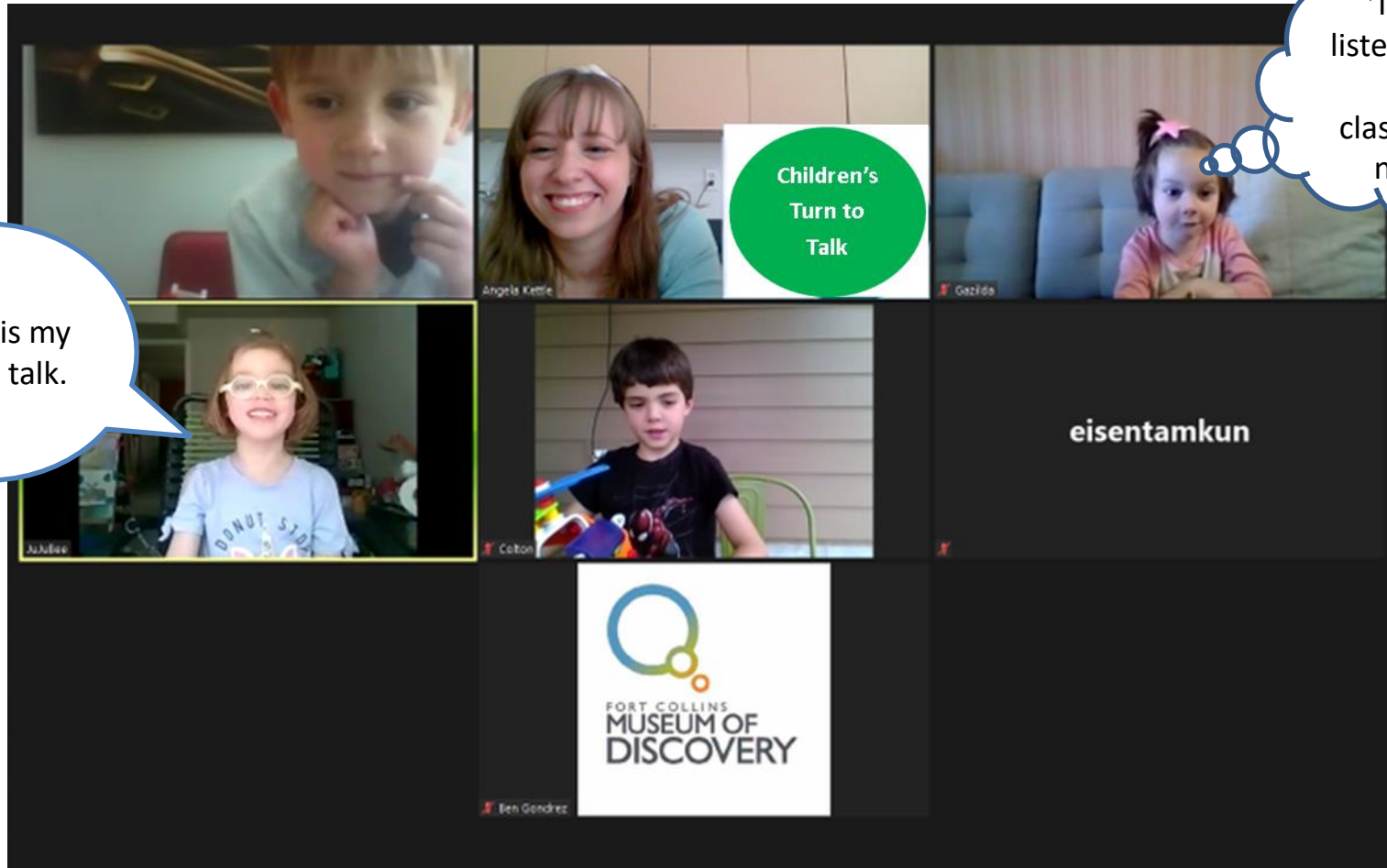


Green Circle Rule: When the teacher has a green circle showing in their screen, it means it is the children's turn to talk. If I want to talk to the whole class, I will raise my hand and wait for the teacher to call on me. Once the teacher calls on me, they will unmute my device. I will say what I am thinking, and everyone will be able to hear me.



It is my turn to talk since the sign is green and the teacher called on me.

When I am done talking, the teacher will mute me again so we can hear other children talk. No one will be able to hear me until the next time the teacher calls on me. I will listen to my classmates when they are talking.

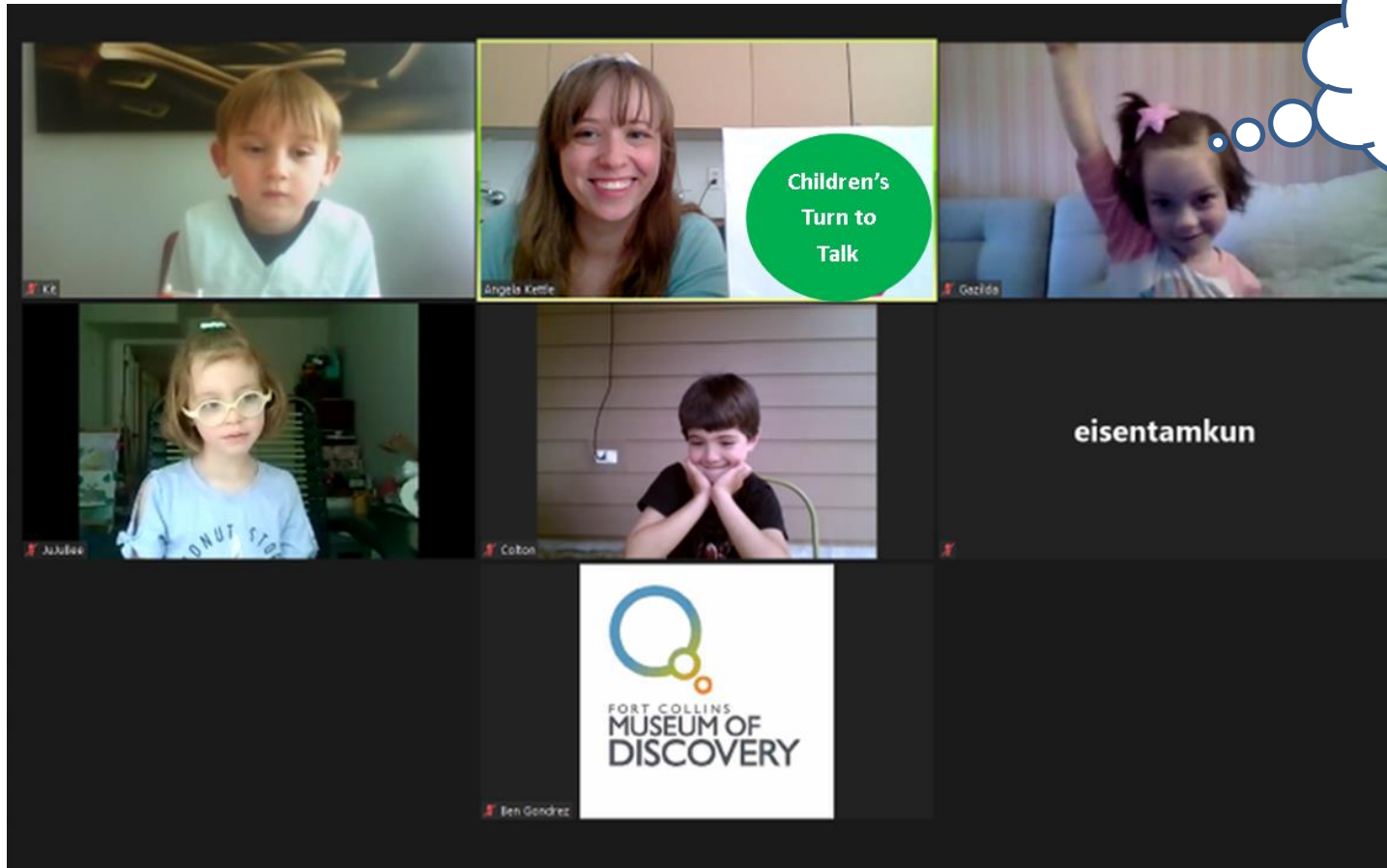
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Pretty soon, the teacher will tell the class that it is time to do an activity. My grown-up and I can choose whether we want to put our device away during this time, or keep it out. My grown-up will help me with the activity. If I want to talk to the teacher during the activity, I will make sure the teacher can see me on Zoom, and I will raise my hand .



After a few minutes, the teacher will start talking again. The teacher will ask me to share what I learned during the activity. If I want to share with the class, I will raise my hand.



Finally, the teacher will show us how to do a craft. I will listen carefully so I can do the craft later on.



Once the teacher has shown everyone the craft, the other children and their grown-ups will leave. I will not be able to see them or hear them anymore. But the teacher will stay on the call. If I have more questions or a story to share, the teacher will call on me and I can share!
