




## **An FCMoD Social Story**

It is very bright and can be loud.






There are people who work for the museum who can help me. They wear nametags that look like thought bubbles.

Respect other people's space.








The museum has lots of bathrooms.

## I can visit many exhibits:

Music & Sound Lab Schatz Family Exploration Zone The Tot Spot Wildlands & Wildlife Animal Encounters Sun, Earth, Universe Food, Forage, & Farm First Peoples People on the Move Natural Areas Healthy Steps

I can touch most things in the museum, but I should not touch them if they are behind rails or glass.





I can play real instruments in the *Music & Sound Lab!* Some of the sounds I will hear are bells, drums, and even a theremin. It can get loud.



The Tot Spot is only for kids that are five years old or younger. There are lots of toys to play with, but it is just for kids ages 0 to 5.



Wildlands & Wildlife teaches me about all the animals of Colorado. They are just stuffed animals though.






Animal Encounters has real live animals like rats, cockroaches, frogs, bees, and Slinky the snake. The animals are safe in their habitats and cannot hurt me.



In Sun, Earth, Universe and the Schatz Family Exploration Zone, I can learn all about the science of wind, outer space, color, and motion.



In the Tornado Chamber, I can feel winds as high as 70 miles per hour. It is fun, but loud!



Some of the exhibits have bright lights and reflective surfaces. I might get overwhelmed. If that happens, I need to tell someone who can bring me to a quiet area.




In Food, Forage, & Farm; First Peoples; and People on the Move, I can learn all about local history. I can see lots of interesting things.

The Archive has many old books and pictures. It is a quiet place for me to go. I can make an appointment with a historian if something interests me.




On the second floor of the museum is the OtterBox Digital Dome Theater. It is dark and loud. It is just pretend, but I can leave if I want to.
